Aged Care Fees Explained

Your contribution towards the cost of care, accommodation and services is subject to your individual financial circumstances and is determined by the Government.

Within Australia's aged care system, there are four possible fees you may be required to pay:

CARE

1. BASIC DAILY FEE

Set by the Commonwealth Government

Payable by all residents (including those in respite care). The basic daily fee is set at 85% of the single person age pension and adjusted by government twice a year in line with the pension review.

2. MEANS TESTED FEE

Set by the Commonwealth Government

Additional fee payable by some residents based on an assessment of the individual's income and assets.*

An estimated interim charge may be calculated at admission.

Covers basic living costs such as meals, cleaning, laundry, heating and cooling.

**There are annual and lifetime caps that apply to the means tested fee.*

3. ACCOMMODATION FEE

RAD (lump sum)

DAP (daily charge)

RAD & DAP (combination)

YOUR CHOICE

Set by the aged care provider

Payment Options - Residents can choose to pay the Accommodation Fee by a refundable accommodation deposit (**RAD**), a daily accommodation payment (**DAP**) or a combination of both.

Covers the cost of accommodation, such as your room, bathroom facilities and access to all communal areas.

You may be eligible to receive government assistance to cover some or all of the accommodation fee based on your income and assets assessment.

SERVICES

4. ADDITIONAL AND/OR EXTRA SERVICES FEE

Set by the aged care provider

Covers items such as entertainment equipment, food services such as alcohol and more menu options, newspapers or magazines and additional technology requirements.
